One main idea/clause. Must Simple - contain a noun and a verb. The cat sat on the mat.

Two main ideas/clauses. Both can stand alone. Usually Compound — joined by 'and'/'or'/'but'. The cat sat on the mat and the dog sat in front of the fire.

At least two clauses. One main (can Complex - stand alone) and one subordinate (doesn't make sense alone) The cat sat on the mat because it was tired.




